### **Would you like to help run a Mutual-Aid Group for people with long-term health conditions?**

Ways to Wellness work holistically to support people between 40-74years in the west of Newcastle with conditions such as diabetes, COPD and heart conditions.

We have one Mutual-Aid Group running which has been so popular that we are seeking volunteers to get involved alongside our workers to start a new group.

PSP and CBD are among the rarer, little known neurodegenerative conditions. It is estimated that around 4000 people in the UK are living with PSP, however, in its early stages, symptoms can resemble those of other neurological conditions such as Parkinson's, and Alzheimer's, meaning that initial misdiagnosis is common and, therefore, that number could be much higher. Both conditions are terminal and there is currently no treatment and no cure for these conditions, but there can be hope. You can be the person that makes the difference by being an ally to those individuals and families who are living with PSP and CBD.

Volunteer Support Workers act as a contact for people living with PSP and CBD (this includes the person with PSP, their family and carer) on behalf of PSPA. You will keep in regular contact by phone, email or face to face visits offering confidential emotional support, and accurate information to enable people with PSP and CBD to make informed choices. It will also involve:

- Offering emotional support and time to talk
- Explaining the range of support and services that PSPA can offer
- Discussing their needs and wishes regarding support from PSPA
- Enabling them to identify problems as they arise and explore how these might be managed, outlining the sorts of options available and how to access these
- Developing and maintaining relationships with your local group if available
- Attending support meetings and other development events.

The role will be based in your own locality. A commitment of 2 hours a week is required. We offer training and support and out of pocket expenses.
